CLEP TRANSFER CREDIT GUIDELINES 2019-2020

The College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) offers a series of exams that test a student’s knowledge of the materials typically covered in college-level general education courses. The exams are administered by national testing centers, usually located at major colleges or universities. Exam registration and further information can be found on the College Board website clep.collegeboard.org or by calling 1-800-257-9558.

- **Submission Deadline** - All CLEP exam scores must be submitted prior to the start of your final semester at MBIDL. Failure to do so will delay your graduation to the subsequent term.
- **50** - A minimum score of 50 is required to accept credit to satisfy MBIDL general education requirements.
- **10** - Academic/test credits that exceed 10 years from the date of completion are not applicable toward current degree curricula.
- **25%** - A maximum of 25% of a MBIDL program can be fulfilled with applicable test and exam credit (AP or CLEP). (Up to **30** credits for BS and up to **15** credits for ABS degrees)
- **Official scores** - When you register to take CLEP, request an official CLEP transcript to be sent to Moody Bible Institute by indicating the CLEP code for MBI (**1486**).
- **Study Guides** - Study guides can be ordered from the CLEP website.

6 credit hours: Biology, Chemistry, College Mathematics, Natural Sciences
Oral and Written Communication (OWC)
3 credit hours of GSU-1110 College Writing AND 3 credit hours of OWC: College Composition (<i>requires essay</i>)
3 credit hours of GSU-1110 College Writing OR 3 credit hours OWC: College Composition Modular (<i>does not require essay</i>)
Social and Behavioral Sciences (SOC)
3 credit hours: Introductory Psychology, Introductory Sociology, Human Growth and Development
Humanities (HUM)
3 credit hours: American Literature, English Literature, Humanities, American Government, History of the United States I, History of the United States II, Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II
6 to 9 credit hours: French Language: Levels 1 & 2, German Language: Levels 1 & 2, Spanish Language: Levels 1 & 2
Open Electives
3 credit hours: Analyzing and Interpreting Literature, Introduction to Educational Psychology, Information Systems, Introductory Business Law, Principles of Management, Principles of Marketing
6 credit hours: Social Sciences and History
