CAMPUS-TO-ONLINE COURSE EQUIVALENCIES – UNDERGRADUATE 2024-25

PURPOSE: For students enrolled in Moody Online programs looking to fulfill requirements with on-campus courses.

This document lists the campus-to-online course equivalencies for Moody Online (MOL) programs. Not all requirements listed are required in all MOL programs. Accordingly, students must confirm their program requirements and the applicability of courses before and after registration using their Program Plan and Academic Requirements Report.

Important: On-campus courses are only available to online students if the instruction mode is compatible with online learning. On-campus instruction modes compatible with online learning include **Highly Flexible** (HyFlex), **Online Synchronous** (or Zoom classroom), and, **in some cases, Hybrid**. Online students are responsible for checking with instructors of on-campus courses before registering and, if necessary, establishing how they will participate as an online student. On-campus courses differ from online courses in content, session dates, structure, assignments and due dates, and expectations. Student is responsible for understanding all requirements by communicating with the instructor and/or reviewing the syllabus.
